SSCGAS EVENTS IN 2023

As the year of 2023 winds down, we can both look back on and look forward to the Society's events of the year.

Normally, we hold five annual fund-raising events but, this year, we had scheduled only three, two of which have already occurred. If any blame can be apportioned to anyone for this disruption in our schedule, we can point a finger to the major and universal disrupter of the past 3 years—COVID 19!

Our expert and well experienced members of our events sub-committee usually plan well ahead of all the events. This includes finding locations for the events and reserving them at least one year ahead of the planned date. This includes submitting either a down-payment of a full payment to the owners of the facilities for a guarantee of the reservations. When COVID struck, large public indoor gatherings were prohibited, so no reservations were made and continued not to be made since we had no idea when the prohibitions would be lifted.

When the restrictions were finally lifted in 2022, we had less than 2 months to prepare for our first event in April, and we were not certain whether our supporters would be brave enough to attend. We planned for a smaller attendance, and we were right in our assumptions as it was not as well attended as in previous occasions. This gave us some pause to consider whether we should proceed with the other events in the rest of the year.

We decided to hold only two more events, one being out-of-doors and which, therefore, we expected to be well-attended (and it was!), and the other being at the end of the year which was far enough distant from the date of the raising of the restrictions to enable our supporters to have more time and experience to feel comfortable at attending an indoor event. Nevertheless, we still planned for a smaller

than usual attendance, and we were right to do so as enough supporters attended to fill the smaller space allocated without having anyone being unable to purchase a ticket to attend.

The uncertainty of 2022 made us still wary of long-term planning for 2023 and, by the time we started to consider whether of not to return to normal, we could not obtain locations for two of the events. However, we have already started looking towards 2024, and the newly elected members of the Executive will have time to make early decisions and reservations.

Spring Dance

We had planned for a pre-pandemic attendance, but we had only about two-thirds of this amount in attendance. Nevertheless, everyone had a good time, and we did make a profit (albeit small) this year.

Golf Event

We had hoped for a full turn-out but ended up with an 83% attendance, mainly due to the event being held on Friday rather than the usual Saturday. This was the only day in the week which had been offered by the Golf Club. Nevertheless, the weather was good, all the players enjoyed themselves, and we did make a good profit though not as much as we had hoped for.

Caribjam and Fall Dance

These two events were cancelled as already explained.

New Year's Eve Gala

We are planning for slightly larger attendance this year, and we expect this event to be sold out well in advance so, if you plan to attend, register early.

Other

We do have one other event this year, but it is not a fund-raiser and is covered separately in the following article.

HONOURING THE COLLEGE AND ITS NAMESAKE

In the Christian tradition, a calendar of saints is organized by associating each day of the year to one or more saints, and that day is referred to as the feast day of the saint. The feast day of St. Stanislaus Kostka, after whom the College is named, occurs on the 13th of November.

The College Alumni Associations in Antigua and Barbuda and in Barbados have always celebrated this day, by a festive get-together in Antigua and Barbuda and by a Mass and a social gathering in Barbados.

The Toronto alumni have never marked this day in any special way but, in October 2022, an alumnus enquired about the possibility of recognizing that date in Toronto, but it was too late to do anything for that year.

In 2023, we will follow Barbados by having a Mass, followed by a get-together with some light refreshments. An Executive member suggested that the Mass should be held, if possible, in a Jesuit-run church as St. Stanislaus was a novice in the Jesuit order. Of the two possible churches in Toronto, the more suitable one is **St. Elizabeth of Hungary, 432 Sheppard Avenue East** (on the north side about 100m west of the Sheppard/Bayview intersection).

This year, the feast day occurs on a Monday. We do not believe that a week-day would be suitable for a good attendance, and neither would Sunday be when there might be a conflict with the normal religious observations of that day. Therefore, we decided on **Saturday 11th November**. This day is also Remembrance Day, but ceremonies to honour this day are in the morning and would not conflict with an event in the afternoon. Therefore, **a Mass will be held at 1:30 p.m., followed by the get-together at about 2:30 p.m. in the church hall** in the basement of the church. The Mass Offertory collection will be donated to the church in appreciation of the use of the church facilities.

There are those alumni who may be non-Catholic Christians, non-Christians, or even non-religious. Nevertheless, we **invite all alumni (and their spouses)** to attend the Mass, as observers if not as participants. If attendance at the Mass is not an option, we invite those who cannot attend to come after the Mass to the get-together.

For catering purposes, we ask that those planning to attend inform us (at lphillips@st-stanislaus-gy.com) as soon as possible, but not later than Wednesday 8th November.

Alumnus (50-57) John Sparrock was an outstanding student at the College. In the school year 56-57, he was the Vice-Captain of the school and played as a full-back on the school's football team. In 1957, he was awarded the Demerara Bauxite Scholarship to attend the University of the West Indies (UCWI) in Jamaica. In the same year, he took the University of London Advanced Level Examination and obtained a pass with distinction in all three subjects (Pure Maths, Applied Maths, and Physics) which he sat. No other student in British Guiana could match this result, so he was awarded the country's highest award, the Guiana Scholarship which enabled him, after achieving a First Class B.Sc. degree at UCWI, to go to England where he earned his Ph.D. degree.

Those alumni who have been members of the Toronto Executive will know or have heard of John. While he lives in New Jersey, U.S.A., he has been active in the Toronto

alumni association. He is responsible for setting up our unique e-mail address (@st-stanislaus-gy.com), has created web-sites to help the school and the association, and was the main driver of the project to digitise the College's Annuals, most of which can now be accessed on the internet ([Stanislaus College Magazines \(st-stanislaus-gy.com\)](http://Stanislaus College Magazines (st-stanislaus-gy.com))).

John paid a "flying" three-day visit to Toronto on the last week-end of July to attend the funeral of the Dr. Karl Mas-siah (from Barbados), the husband of his cousin, Dr. Pam DaCamara, both of whom were at UCWI when John was there. Some of the Toronto alumni were at College and at UCWI with John, but none of the other alumni had ever met him in person, so we took the opportunity to invite him (and Peter, his son who drove him to Toronto) to a Saturday lunch to effect a meeting.

John and Peter returned to New Jersey on Sunday.

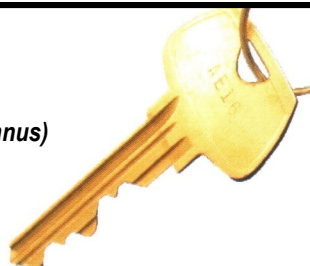

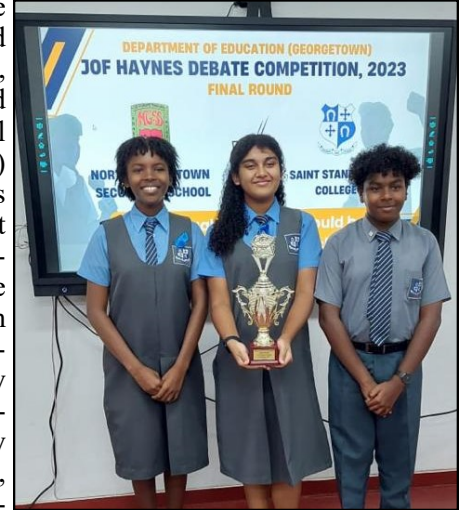
SAINTS WINS DEBATING COMPETITION

In this past July, the St. Stanislaus College debating team emerged victorious in the JOF Haynes (Georgetown chapter) 2023 debating competition which was held in the Smart Room of St. Stanislaus College.

The members of the team were Reginald Brown (1st speaker), Italy Ton-Chung (2nd speaker), and Aziel Arthur (3rd speaker) who was selected as the overall Best Speaker of the competition. To win the competition, the team defeated New Campbellville Secondary (Round One), Dolphin Secondary (Round Two), Queenstown Secondary (Round Three), St. Rose's High School in the Semi Finals, and the North Georgetown Secondary School in the Finals.

In the Finals opposing the moot, 'Sexual Education should be mandatory in Secondary Schools', the Saints team outwitted its opponent with what was described as a well-structured and excellent rebuttal, helped also by the first speaker of the proposing team fumbling a great deal which allowed Saints to win by 20 points (256-236).

Saints will be representing Georgetown in the regional debating competitions to be announced at a later date.



SAINTS ARE BASKETBALL CHAMPIONS IN GEORGETOWN REGION

In the 17th edition of the National School Basketball Festival (NSBF) tournament, organized in June by the Youth Basketball Guyana (YBG) and sponsored by ExxonMobil, the St. Stanislaus College team won the Georgetown Conference boys' U18 section.

To win the conference, Saints defeated Queen's College in the quarter-finals, St. Rose's in the semi-finals, and Bishops' in the finals.

They now have to play against the champions of the other conferences to decide which is the best team in the country.

GDF OFFICER COMPLETES COMMAND AND GENERAL STAFF COURSE OVERSEAS

A senior officer of the Guyana Defence Force (GDF) has successfully completed the Command and General Staff Course at the Command and General Staff College (CGSC), Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, USA.

The officer, **alumnus Colonel Sheldon Howell**, was among 1200 students from 93 countries enrolled at the college for the last academic year.

During his programme, Colonel Howell also completed a Master of Operational Studies from the CGSC and a Master of Science in Human Resource Administration from Central Michigan University, USA.

The curriculum of the CGSC focuses on enhancing leadership skills, strategic thinking, and problem-solving abilities, and covers a wide range of subjects including military operations, national security policy, military history, and joint operations, the GDF said in a statement posted on its Facebook page.

Leaving a legacy of influencing his colleagues to be better professionals, Colonel Howell was recognized for

his maturity and intelligence which elevated the experience and education of his classmates.

Colonel Howell stated that completing the CGSC has been a transformative and challenging experience, for which he is immensely grateful.

“Throughout the course, I have been exposed to a comprehensive curriculum that has sharpened my leadership skills, strategic thinking abilities and operational planning expertise,” he said.

In addition, he also expressed his appreciation to the dedicated and knowledgeable instructors who selflessly imparted their wisdom, guidance, and practical experiences, shaping him into a more capable and effective senior leader. He registered his appreciation for the Guyana Defence Board’s confidence in him by approving his attendance.

Colonel Sheldon was congratulated by the Chief-of-Staff of the GDF, Brigadier Omar Khan, for his successful completion of the programme.

ALUMNA JESSICA CALLENDER BECOMES GUYANA’S WOMEN’S CHESS CHAMPION

In the Guyana Chess Federation’s Women’s National Chess Championship tournament, sponsored by Diamond Insurance, **alumna Jessica Callender** played unbeaten over two weekends in August to emerge as the champion. The 21-year-old Callender, who works as a videographer in the *News Room*, is currently rated as the highest active female chess player in Guyana and has entered her name in the annals of local chess with her maiden national title.

In the tournament, Callender played unbeaten, though drawing her games against Aniyah Couchman and Anaya Lall, and ended up with eight points after nine rounds.

The championship came down to a clash between Callender and qualifying champion Sasha Shariff on the final day. The final point Callender earned in this game solidified her victory.

After drawing in their encounter during the qualifying



rounds, the duo played a tense four-and-a-half-hour match, with both sides eager to secure the victory. They both played a symmetrical English opening. By move 66, Callender had captured all of Shariff’s pieces and was up a Queen. She checkmated her opponent 10 moves later.

Callender is a former UG Chess Champion and has represented Guyana on multiple occasions, including the most recent FIDE chess Olympiad in India. However, this is her first national title. She is currently ranked 10th overall in ratings for all active chess players in Guyana, as of August 2023.

Callender is also quite active in developing chess locally as a member of the Women in Chess Committee, a volunteer coach in the GCF Chess club, and part-time assistant arbiter in some youth tournaments.
